IFSU home gardening project wins in nat'l extension confab

estifying the University's excellence in implementing sustainable extension and engaging the community, Ifugao State University (IFSU) reaped the Best Paper Award in the first National Extension Conference organized online by the Southern Leyte State University on March 21-22, 2023.

The project "Home Gardening: A Response to Household Food Security in Ifugao" by authors Ms. Marah Joy A. Nanglegan and Nemie Rex S. Guerzon emerged victorious among 33 papers presented under the Education Track.

Spearheaded by the Department of Extension and Training (DET), the project aimed to promote home/ backyard gardening in response to food security in Ifugao by engaging farmers/community members/ children in home gardening, promoting Organic Agriculture and Good Agricultural Practices, and augmenting vegetable food needs of Ifugao families.

Participants improved their knowledge, attitude, and skills in Organic Agriculture Production (OAP) and Agricultural Crops Production (ACP) technologies. It also contributed to the health and wellness of beneficiaries, considering that what they produced was free from chemicals and inorganic fertilizers. Aside from that, the project alleviated the boredom of the kids and the family during the lockdown.

"Financially/economically, home gardening can augment the food needs of families and can serve as additional income to households. Environmentally, participants showed adoption of OAP and ACP technologies and the patronage of OAP and ACP products," added Ms. Nanglegan.//

fficials from Mountain Province State Polytechnic College (MPSPC) visited Ifugao State University (IFSU) to learn about the university's best practices and initiatives on Futures Thinking and Strategic Foresight on March 8, 2023, at the Multipurpose Hall, Admin Building, Lamut, Ifugao.

The team was led by Dr. Mark Preston Lopez, Vice President for Academic Affairs, and Dr. Epiphania B. Magwilang, Vice President for Research Development and Extension.

In her Welcome Remarks, University President Dr. Eva Marie Codamon-Dugyon, represented by Dr. Marissa P. Bulong, Vice President for Research Development, Extension and Training (RDET), stated that the benchmarking activity is a great performance measurement tool to help them start their plans and guide the direction of their interest for the benefit of their university.

"We hope that your team can develop new procedures or enhance existing ones to meet the standard on Futures Thinking and Strategic Foresight," added Dr. Bulong. Directors from the RDET

of Extension and Training
(DET); Jude C. Baggo of
the Globally Important
Agricultural Heritage Systems
(GIAHS) Center; and Dr.
Elpidio B. Basilio, Jr. of the
Department of Research and
Development enlightened the
team through a discussion
of the Futures Thinking
highlights, programs, and
activities being undertaken by
IFSU.

The visit concluded with a tour at the Ifugao Rice Terraces - GIAHS Center and the University Rice Cultural Museum. "We hope to weave cohesive future-proof programs, projects, and activities together through collaboration and networking," added Dr. Bulong.

Futures Thinking' is a scientific method of informed reflection on the major changes that will occur in the next 10, 20, or more years in all areas of social life, including education. This mindset, as applied to State Universities and Colleges (SUCs), will help university officials in analyzing post-COVID outcomes based on available technologies and intelligence worldwide.

The 'Futures Thinking' initiative of IFSU centers on creating a Knowledge Management System of IRT.

food production that locals can adopt; develop the area for agricultural tourism; and conduct continuing research based on the principles of regenerative agriculture.

The model farm is a response of IFSU University President and CARASUC Chair Dr. Eva Marie Codamon-Dugyon to the call of Dr. Anduyan for SUCs in the region to implement innovative projects that will uplift the lives of the communities. The project was funded by the IFSU Admin from its Higher Education Innovation and Research Fund under the University's General Appropriations Act. The first of its kind in the region, the farm is located beside the IRT-GIAHS center of the IFSU – Lamut Campus.

On the other hand, Project STORE, or Skills Training to Rejuvenate Entrepreneurship aims to enhance the intention of creating spaces for the Cordillera Region to climb the ranks of the entrepreneurship ladder in the country. It further aims to harmonize the activities of SUCs and establish a regional academy managed and initiated by Higher Education.

Meanwhile, the CARASUC hymn, composed and arranged by Rec. Fr. Daniel P. Cariño, was launched with MPSPC Minstrels singing it on stage for the first time. The hymn is a source of pride for SUCs in the Cordillera Administrative Region and a symbol of their unity and solidarity.

The Cordillera Heritage 101, the newest subject to be integrated into the general curriculum in higher education institutions in CAR, was expounded by IFSU Professor Serafin L. Ngoyahon. The 3-unit course preserves and focuses on the history and heritage of the Cordillerans.

"The launching of these four pioneering projects is a testament to CARASUC's commitment to excellence in education and its dedication to serving the people in the region by improving the agriculture landscape, promoting entrepreneurship, and preserving the culture and heritage of the Cordilleras," said Dr. Dugyon.//

Novel activities mark Nat'l Women's Month celeb in IFSU

In solidarity with the National Women's Month Celebration (NWMC), Ifugao State University (IFSU) through the Gender and Development Research and Resource Center (GADRRC) organized a series of activities throughout March to promote women's empowerment and gender equality.

To kick off the month-long celebration, University President Dr. Eva Marie Codamon-Dugyon led a pledge on the first Monday of the month for IFSU to continue being on the frontline in raising awareness and helping solve critical issues hindering women's empowerment.

One of the highlights of the celebration was the "Serbisyo i Bugan" program, a free blood diagnostic test provided to employees in partnership with the University Clinic and EDD Diagnostic Laboratory. Participants were checked for cholesterol levels, glucose, and uric acid on March 30 at the University Clinic, Lamut campus.

GADRRC, in collaboration with the University Clinic and the College of Health Sciences (CHS), organized a health seminar on breast and cervical cancer for students and employees on March 21, 2023.

Medical professionals Dr. Theresa H. Kalugdan, Municipal Health Officer of Lagawe, and Dr. Meynard Keynes Q. de la Cruz of Panopdopan District Hospital, shared vital information about women's health issues. They also provided practical advice on how to maintain a healthier lifestyle.

An orientation on "Gender and Development (GAD) and Gender Fair Language" and "Sex and Gender concepts, Sex and Gender Roles, and Gender Issues/Biases" was also organized for newly hired employees of all employment status on March 22, 2023. The activity is one of the strategies of the University in gender mainstreaming to stop gender bias and reduce gender stereotyping and discrimination in the workplace. On March 8, a training session on Digital Graphic Design was conducted, emphasizing the theme of International Women's Day: "DigitALL: Innovation and Technology for Gender Equality."

As part of the celebration, employees participated in the #PurpleWalk, a trek along the University eco-park trail in Mabato-bato, Lamut, Ifugao.

Wearing purple shirts and carrying purple balloons, they journeyed to the peak of the mountain, enjoying a breathtaking view of the plains of Lamut town. To prioritize the health and fitness of employees, the University organized ZumBAYOLET sessions every Friday afternoon.

In a visual display of support, offices across the campus decorated their spaces in purple. Additionally, since the launch of the celebration, the University encouraged the observance of #PurpleWednesdays, where students and staff wore anything purple to show their solidarity.//

In his Opening Remarks, Dr. Donato O. Abaya, Dean of CAS, expressed optimism for the training to arm students with skills and knowledge essential to their chosen profession.

"Through this training, I hope you can become peer counselors and mentors who touch someone's heart by listening, promoting, and empowering them," Dr. Abaya said.

Mr. Aiken Dale K. Magaya, Program Chairperson, who shared the Overview of the Activity identified 'academic stress' as a common problem among IFSU students based on local research by Dulawan and Umoltog (2021).

"You will be stewards of hope for those in need, helping someone deal with their academic challenges, and aid in achieving the mission of the University to produce employable graduates upholding excellence," stressed Mr. Magaya. Guidance Counselors from Saint Mary's University (SMU) and Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) served as resource speakers and trainers.

Mr. Reiner Dulawan, Guidance Counselor of SMU, centered his topics on Understanding Crisis and Its Impacts and Peer Support and Guidance Services. Mr. Jefferson L. Callangan, Guidance Counselor of NVSU, administered the Introduction to Psychological First Aid (PFA) training.

PFA is an intervention that seeks to reduce stress symptoms and assist in a healthy recovery following a traumatic event, natural disaster, public health emergency, or even a personal crisis. Moreover, Mary Ann B. Lorenzo, Guidance Counselor from NVSU, discussed the importance of Practices and Self-care to reduce or eliminate anxiety and depression, reduce stress, and increase happiness, among others.//

Patent search and patent mining are two essential tools for researchers and inventors to analyze and identify gaps in the capabilities of their innovation systems to enhance their research output. The workshop aimed to equip the university's researchers with the necessary skills and knowledge on patent search and patent mining.

The resource speakers for the event were Engineers Wilfredo O. Calaguan, Francis Louise Gutierrez, Ma. Concepcion Zabala, together with Ms. Brianne Nicole Sanchez, and Ms. Ma. Winelma M. Garcia, all from the Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines. They shared their expertise on the subject matter and provided valuable insights on the importance of intellectual property rights protection.

During the workshop, ten research outputs were produced and critiqued for their utility model, copyright, and patent. The university's researchers worked closely with the resource speakers to evaluate and identify possible patentable ideas, which could be further developed and registered under their names.

As part of the celebration, the IPCWTBMC also held a caravan in all IFSU campuses to promote the center's services.
