# ABOUT IFSU

The historical development of IFSU is a chronicle of triumph amidst adversity from a community farm school transforming into a University.

IFSU started as a Nayon Settlement Farm School in 1920 and renamed as Ifugao Pilot Opportunity School of Agriculture (IPOSA) in 1959. In 1967, the high school department was established and subsequently renamed as Payon Bugan Pilot Opportunity School of Agriculture (PBPOSA). In 1972, it was elevated into Ifugao Agricultural and Technical College (IATC) offering secondary and tertiary/undergraduate programs. In 1982, it was further expanded into Ifugao State College of Agriculture and Forestry (ISCAF) offering various Baccalaureate and Master Courses.

The quest for University statehood started in 2003 with expansion of programs to other field in the baccalaureate and graduate studies. In 2007, ISCAF was declared as a Level III State College. Immediately thereafter, a bill for its conversion into a university was filed in the House of Representatives by then Cong. Solomon R. Chungalao.

On October 14, 2009, Republic Act No. 9720 was signed into law formally converting ISCAF into Ifugao State University with campuses in Lamut, Aguinaldo, Hapao, Lagawe, Potia and Tinoc.

Today, IFSU is the lone tertiary school in Ifugao. Through the years, IFSU increasingly developed its programs to conform with government educational standards and to meet the growing educational needs of the community.

IFSU is determined for recognition from the local as well as international arena for quality and relevant education.

Being a University within the communities of its indigenous peoples, IFSU recognizes the importance of integrating indigenous knowledge, systems and practices in its curricular programs. Thus, the preservation and conservation of Ifugao culture and traditions.





At least 23 out of 29 programs were accredited.


There is also a marked increase in the passing rate for four programs namely: Agriculture, BEEd, Midwifery and Criminology in 2018.


New learning facilities were installed in the classrooms such as LCD, audio system, computers and internet accessibility to improve learning opportunities for students.

# FACULTY PROFILE

In 2018, there is an increased number of faculty with Masters and Doctorate Degrees.

From 2017 data, there is an additional six (6) for master's degree and nine (9) doctorate degree.

# **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

In terms of the 2018 average overall performance of schools (POS), five (5) IFSU fields registered higher ratings than the average 2018 national passing rates (NPR) in those particular areas. These are the licensure exams for Foresters (POS = 66.18% against NPR = 59.01%), Criminologists (59.68% against 34.01%), Elementary Teachers (28.98% against 21.96%), Midwives (70.00% against 43.43%), and Agriculturists (47.22% against

38.14%). Meanwhile, IFSU recorded lower POS ratings than the NPRs in the licensure exams for Nurses, Civil Engineers, Secondary Teachers, and Accountants. (Note: Exam takers in Nursing and Midwifery from the Lamut Campus are all repeaters.)

# PERCENTAGE OF IFSU 1ST TIME TAKERS WHO PASSED IN 2018 LICENSURE EXAMINATIONS


Of the 611 first-time exam takers from IFSU, 346 (57%) passed their respective fields. This is higher than the national passing rate for first-time takers which is 51.58% (118,719 out of 226,312 examinees). On the other hand, the 2018 rating is 6% lower than the 2017 IFSU passing rate of 63%.

## 2018 PERFORMANCE OF 1ST TIME-TAKERS IN LICENSURE EXAMINATIONS



#### EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT







# ACRICULTURE HUNGER

The Ifugao State University continues to take stride in developing innovative researches and programs in agriculture as one of its banner programs.

These researches and programs are geared towards improved instruction, projects, and programs that are responsive to the needs of the University and communities.

It further aims to foster collaboration and partnerships with different stakeholders to provide relevant and responsive to the needs of the province and its nearby areas.

## STATE-OF-THE-ART POST-HARVEST FACILITY

The municipality of Alfonso Lista and its nearby areas are the primary producers of corn and other grain products in the province.

Recognizing the prevailing economic condition, the Ifugao State University in partnership with the Department of Agriculture constructed a state-of-the-art grain dryer in the University which is designed to process a maximum of 230 cavans of corn and other grains in one setting.

Primarily, the machine will be used for instruction, research and resource generation for the University.

Furthermore, the grain dryer provides post-harvest facility for local farmers.

## IFSU NUCLEUS HERD PROJECT

The Province of Ifugao is home to one of the unique strains of native pigs. Based from the research of Dr. Elpidio B. Basilio, Jr., the Ifugao native pigs are resilient and with low cost maintenance.

As an offshoot of his PhD dissertation, he established the IFSU Nucleus Herd Project in partnership with the Bureau of Animal Industry of the Department of Agriculture.

The Nucleus Herd Project primarily aims to modify and purify the native pigs before they will be distributed to host farmers and communities as an additional source of livelihood to farmers.

This project further recognizes the indispensable importance of pigs among the Ifugao people during important gatherings and occasions.





## HIGHLAND VEGETABLE AND GREEN HOUSE DEMO FARMS

IFSU is pioneering research on highland crops and vegetables. IFSU Tinoc Campus constructed Organic Highland Vegetable Demonstration Farm and Green House Farm for research, instruction and extension purposes.

These demonstration farms are one of the efforts of the University to study the unprecedented expansion of highland or temperate crops in the municipality.

With these demo farms and other programs, IFSU Tinoc extends its expertise in agricultural technology to influence farmers on Good Agricultural Practices.

With its two local radio programs, IFSU brings out a new dimension on the School-on-Air. These radio programs are being maximized to reach the wider public on the programs and projects of the University.





In 2017, Ifugao State University was chosen as one of the partners of the University of National and World Economy, Bulgaria in the three-year project INNOTAL, short for "Integrating Talent Development into Innovation Ecosystems in Higher Education," which is co-funded by the European Union and is being implemented in the framework of the Erasmus+ Programme: Capacity Building in Higher Education.
